Throughout the month of November—our "Give Thanks Month"—a handful of members have shared their testimonies about why they continue to give their time, talents, and treasures to Lord of Life. Each person who shared admitted to feeling nervous, but this has been an invaluable discipleship moment. As 1 Peter 3:15 reminds us, "...always be ready to give your testimony to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you."

In the spirit of Thanksgiving, I want to express how deeply grateful I am for Lord of Life. The people here truly desire to deepen their relationships with God and with one another by loving and serving others. It is a true honor to serve as Pastor to such a wonderful community.

## **Committee Reports**

#### **Christian Education:**

"During this Lenten season, Pastor Adam had been conducting the Bible classes in the evening at 6 p.m. prior to the Holden Evening Service. Numerology has significance in the Bible and specifically these 40 days of Lent. Other periods of 40 days discussed Jesus' being in the wilderness. In Exodus, Moses led the Israelites in the wilderness for 40 days and had communications with God. Thereafter, the Israelites wandered in the Sinai for 40 years and only Caleb and Joshua, of the original group were living to enter the Promised Land. Pastor Adam describes the region and what the limitations were for the people and why God did not permit those who questioned him to enter the Promised Land> All are welcome to join the interesting discussions". - Connie Allekian

#### Finance:

October donations were modest. The \$15,828 total is the fourth lowest October in the last ten years, trailing an extraordinary 2023 (\$44,132) by \$28,304 while exceeding a modest 2022 (\$15,147) by \$682. October expenses (\$21,961) were higher than 2023 by \$380 and higher than 2022 by \$3,429. October operations generated a \$6,133 deficit. The year-to-date deficit increased to \$50,396, again the highest at the end of ten months.

At the end of ten months, 83.33% of the year, 82.5% of the budget was spent. Most categories that exceeded 83.33% were highly seasonal. However, it should be noted that in prior years the percent expended has been several percent lower than the completed portion of the year.

Donations through October recorded in Shepherd's Staff agree in total and by fund with the financial records.

No pass-through funds are overdrawn. Ten on-line donations totaling \$724.62 were received by the last counters report date (10/28/24). There was one \$20 Thrivent donation (YTD there have been 4 Thrivent donations totaling \$148).

The balance sheet remains strong. There is no long term debt. Total assets have decreased by \$49,736 since 12/31/23. The decrease is due to the operational deficit and payments for the gathering place project. Without phenomenal donations during November and December totaling approximately \$87,000, Lord of Life will end 2024 with a substantial operational deficit. - James T. Kelly, Treasurer

- Committee budget requests for the 2025 budget are due to Jim Kelly
- The Bulletin Board/Narthex subcommittee was allotted \$100.00 from the Hospitality committee budget to purchase bulletin board/narthex seasonal decorations
- Due to additional purchases, the new profits from the Treasures in the Trunk sale is \$886.45
- Thus far, \$1,470.00 has been raised for the ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response-Hurricane Relief.
- The Adopt a Plot subcommittee was allotted \$1,000.00 from the Property committee budget for landscaping.
- Council approved increases in the salary of the Pastor, the administrative assistant, the music director and the custodian with final approval at the Congregational meeting in January.
- Church room rates were increased: Fellowship Hall=\$125.00; West Room=\$100.00; North Room=\$75.00; Kitchen=\$75.00; South Room=\$30.00.
- The Children and Hunger committee will collect 4 large bins and 2 small bins of Christmas dinner food for Mt. Carmel
- The next Lord of Life adventure is a trip to a Wolves game in February 1st.
